

## AMSE – IMCHILD PhD grant 2019-2022

### Call for applications

The **Impact of Childhood Circumstances on Individual Outcomes over the Life-Course**



The [Aix-Marseille School of Economics](http://www.amse-aixmarseille.fr) is inviting applications for a three-year PhD grants starting in fall 2019.

The PhD candidate will be enrolled in the [AMSE PhD program](#) and supervised by an AMSE faculty member. The monthly gross salary is 1 758 €. This amount includes social security coverage but is not net of income taxes. Teaching assistant positions might be available. AMSE PhD program yearly tuition fees amount about 400 €.

IMCHILD is a network funded by national research agencies of different European countries (France, Germany, Luxembourg, Sweden) to investigate issues related to equality of opportunity in a European context. The specificity of the research program is to focus on the life cycle perspective, from cradle to retirement. The two supervisors will be Alain Trannoy (Aix-Marseille Université) and Arnaud Lefranc (Université de Cergy-Pontoise).

As part of the IMCHILD network, the research project should address issues related to equality of opportunity and intergenerational mobility.

### Application procedure

Applicants must hold, prior to September 2019, the AMSE master in Economics, research track (Économie Théorique et Empirique) or a Master in economics from an institution that provides a level of training in economics at least as good as that of the AMSE. Applications are welcome from both French and non-French nationals. Knowledge of French is not necessary.
