In the 1960s, the fertility rate of Japanese women fell below the generational replacement rate of 2.1 children per woman. Since then, it has never increased. This is the main driving force behind the tremendous demographic aging in Japan, which is often considered a "world laboratory" for this phenomenon. Faced with alarming projections that the Japanese population will be reduced by half by 2100, the government has deployed demographic surveys to provide a means of ensuring the social and economic sustainability of this phenomenon. We show that these surveys focus on the macroscopic aspects of aging. On the other hand, in the composition of the questionnaires, as well as in the nature of the proposed policies, the question of solidarity is ignored, even though it is at the heart of the concerns outlined by the European surveys. This lack of interest is, in our opinion, a determining explanatory factor for the inability of Japanese birth policies to achieve their objectives, since the disintegration of family and social ties is a powerful disincentive to motherhood. In the Japanese context of the absence of descendants to rely on and the isolation of the elderly, this point deserves, in our opinion, the necessary attention in order to develop policy responses that are appropriate to the challenge they face.
